40	German WW II political leaders dress belt buckle. - This lot consists of a large fancy gilt metal buckle (2 1/4" diameter) displaying a large spread wing political style eagle superimposed over an oak leaf wreath. Buckle is complete with its claw belt attachment which also carries over the gilded oak leaf design. Reverse of buckle displays a RZM "M4/77" mark. Very good condition.
41	German WW II Army shooting aiguillette . - This lot presents a higher grade shooting award in the form of a 10" very heavy braided aluminum cord attached to a bullion oval displaying a 2 1/4" gilded metal device with crossed swords surrounded by oak leaves with eagle swastika device. These cords were worn across the right tunic breast of the recipient with loops to attach to a button beneath the right shoulder board and attached to the second tunic button. Entire cord negative to UV/black-light and is in fine condition.
42	German WW II Luftwaffe cloth insignia group. - This lot consists of a matching pair of Luftwaffe Oberleutnant of artillery collar tabs. These tabs display bullion aluminum embroidered oak leaf spring with two gull wings directly embroidered on a red wool field piped in silver aluminum braid. The reverse of each tab is fitted with four small stubs to allow easy attachment and removal from the tunic collar. This feature was usually employed on summer white Luftwaffe tunics. Excellent.
43	German WW II enlisted man collar tab grouping. - Lot consists of one pair of enlisted tabs for medical personnel with sewn backing. Also three examples of enlisted tabs all mounted and backed with different color inserts. Also included are four unissued bands of collar tab facing for panzer personnel. Good.
44	German WW II transport troops shoulder boards. - Lot consists of a pair of Hauptmann (Captain) shoulder boards. Boards display muted gray braid overlay with cornflower blue piping/backing representing Army Transport Troops. Both sewn-in tabs show use at the facing end and each display two darkened metal pips between which are two metallic regimental numbers. Good condition.
45	German WW II cloth insignia group. - Lot consists of a metallic BeVo embroidered NSKK eagle with 3" wing span. Reverse retains most of its RZM original label. Lot also includes a BeVo embroidered Army Jaeger specialty sleeve patch displaying three green oak leaf sprigs on dark green backing surrounded by an embroidered twisted rope design. Both of these insignia are mint unissued condition.
46	German WW II visor cap insignia group. - This lot consists of a gilt bullion embroidered cap device for Kriegsmarine officer cap, an Army silver metallic embroidered wreath device for Army officers visor cap, and a set of gold bullion embroidered wreath and eagle for general's rank. The Naval wreath shows wear whereas the other items of the group are in excellent condition. Overall very good condition.
47	German WW II Allgemeine SS officers armband. - This example is made of six individual sewn pieces and displays a large black two piece swastika sewn directly sewn to a ribbed white circle machine sewn to a red wool band. The rims of this band are finished in 10mm wide black ribbed stripes. This armband does not show any indication of having a RZM tag and test UV negative. Very good condition.
48	Lot of USSR Commerative medals. - This medal group consists of three per-1989 Russian Commerative medals the earliest of which was issued in 1948 for the thirtieth year of Lenin-Stalinist rule. Very good.
49	German WW II medal lot. - This lot consists of an unissued West Wall medal and ribbon with its original named packet. Also, a NSDAP party pin showing "RZM" and maker's marks on reverse. No damage to enamel front. Very good condition.
50	German WW II NSKK insignia group. - Lot consists of two pieces of NSKK tunic insignia including a single collar tab of black wool displaying metal devices presenting the unit designation "31/M137". Lot also includes a metallic BeVo sleeve diamond with an eagle superimposed over and embroidered wheel. This example retains its entire blue and white numbered RZM tag glued to reverse. In unissued condition. Excellent condition.
51	German WW II NSDAP sleeve band. - This lot presents an unusual NSDAP band of 17 1/4" in length but only 1 7/8" in width. This printed cotton example presents the standard swastika in a white circle on a red field. Inspection of the reverse shows the edges folded and machine sewn. An unusual but well documented NSDAP band. The entire band is UV (black light) negative. Excellent unissued condition.
52	German WW II cloth insignia devices. - This lot consists of a machine embroidered band over 25 "in length, 1 3/4" wide displaying a repeat pattern of diamond shaped white BeVo embroidered swastikas on a band displaying interwoven black swastikas. One end shows two metal attaching clips sewn to the reverse to engage two metal loops sewn to the opposite end. Early period photographs show this device utilized as a band on visor caps usually on veteran organization head gear. Lot also includes a Hitler Youth sleeve diamond measuring 3 5/8" x 2 3/8" displaying an upward pointing white arrow intersecting the circular wording "LEISTUNGEN IN DER H.J." surrounded by and embroidered swastika. The entire diamond is edged in a thin BeVo woven white border. Very good condition.
53	German WW II Luftwaffe officers shoulder boards. - This lot consists of a matching set displaying bullion braid facing sewn over a red wool piping/backing representing a major of artillery in the Luftwaffe. Both boards retain their original slip-on tabs. Very good condition.
54	German WW II NSDAP triangular pennant. - This item presents a double sided small scale NSDAP pennant measuring 10" base to tip. Each side displays a black BeVo woven swastika on white circle machine sewn to each side of the banner. A single attachment ring remains at its base. Banner shows use but no damage. Good condition.
55	German WW II SS identification tag. - This item is made of stamped aluminum, measures 2 1/4" x 2" and is stamped with the following; "SS 105 A" (Blood group) /"GEN. Kp. G.E.B. 514". This disc as with all German "dog tags", displays long opened lines used for separating the duplicating sides. Good worn condition.
56	German WW II silvered panzer assault badge. - Badge is of stamped silvered metal "hollow back" design with all attachment furniture intact. Very good.
57	German WW II "NARVIK" shield. - This example presents a stamped metal shield with an eagle above a shield device with NARVIK /1940 with propeller, anchor and Edelweiss on its face. These devices represent the German Army, Luftwaffe and Naval forces that participated in this battle. The zinc stamped shield is complete with a blue gray wool backing further backed by gray paper through which can be seen the outline of the attachment pins. Metal shows oxidation. Very good.

58	German WW II medal lot. - This lot consists of an Eastern Front medal complete with correct ribbon and a WW I silver wound badge. The Eastern Front medal retains virtually all of its blue-gray finish whereas the Silvered Wound Badge has lost most of its finish on its obverse but is complete with attachment pin and catch. Both medals are unmarked. Lot also includes a Luftwaffe worker's badge normally carried by personnel assigned to a specific air field. The stamped and gilded badge displays a flying eagle holding swastika against a light blue painted background below which is a four digit number. Complete with a large attachment pin. Very good condition.
59	German WW II NARVIK shield. - This lot presents a NARVIK campaign shield of stamped zinc showing significant oxidation. This shield is attached to a dark blue wool backing which is stained with white oxidation. The reverse of the badge is covered with a thin paper backing which has lifted showing four attachment pins bent in facing position. Good condition.
60	German WW II DEMJANSK" campaign shield. - This example stamped from darkened sheet zinc metal presents an eagle residing between a wood pill box emplacement with "DEMJANSK" below. Remainder of the shield presents two crossed swords with an oncoming aircraft flying between the blades and the date "1942" below. The shield rests on a cut oval gray-green wool backing and is attached by four metal pins to a metal backplate covered by a green-gray paper backing. Very good condition.
61	German WW II NSDAP fifteen year long service award. - This lot presents a fancy heavy medal forming a Maltese Cross with sunburst rays separating the four blue enameled "arms". Each side also displays an eagle/swastika surrounded by oak leaf circle. The cross is silver plated and is suspended from a ring with a cornflower blue and double silver edged ribbon. The ring on this example is unmarked. Unissued condition.
62	German WW II Luftwaffe Ground Combat Award. - This lot presents a badge of standard Luftwaffe design with spread wing eagle superimposed over black oxidized clouds from which a darkened lightening bolt protrudes terminating in the "ground", all of which is surrounded by an oval leaf cluster. The eagle on this later period example is soldered to its base. The slightly vaulted reverse with three top piercings displays a standard hinge with straight thin pin and a "c" catch soldered to a small circular plate which was then affixed to the metal reverse. This example is marked with the letters "G.B." on the reverse. Very good,
63	German WW II SA Sports award. - This example presents an early version of the SA sports badge in bronze showing a mainly intact bronzed finish. The reverse of the swastika is very well marked but does not include a serial number. The bronze "C" catch appears shorter than original but still functions to retain the pin. Very good.
64	German WW II women's medal group. - This lot consists of two pieces of women's RAD (Labor Corp) metal insignia to include a silvered woman's brooch and a stamped metal cap device. Lot also includes a women's NSDAP Membership pin for the German FRAUENSCHAFHT black/white enameled triangular pin. All three pieces are complete with their attachment devices. Good condition.
65	German WW II Metal pin grouping. - Lot consists of three metal stamped tinnies including a 1935 dated SAAR pin and a gilt SA tinnie. Lot also includes two metal shields used with the Army shooting aiguillette missing its attachment pins. Good condition.
66	German WW II Infantry Assault badge. - This lot presents a solid back version of the Infantry Assault badge displaying a flash silver finish most of which is retained on this example. The reverse displays a standard hinge pin device with "C" catch on the reverse. In very good condition.
67	German WW II metal visor cap eagle group. - This lot includes one example of a Waffen SS cap device of stamped metal which has lost virtually all of its silvered finish. Reverse is stamped "SS 360/44" and "RZM" within double circle. Both attachment pins remain in place. Lot also includes two small scale political/para-military style gilded eagles each missing one of its attachment pins. Good.
68	German WW II insignia lot. - Lot includes three pins (tinnies) issued during political gatherings one from the infamous Nordhausen area where the V2 was assembled by slave labor. Lot also includes two stick pins one representing a German veterans association and a stamped plastic and painted tinnie representing the green and white standarte of the Hermann Goring Division. Very good condition.
69	German WW II officers collar tabs and KRIM Shield. - This lot presents a matching pair of officers collar tabs displaying a yellow-gold insert (Recon/Signals). Both pieces show oxidation/discoloration to the silver bullion embroidered facing. Lot also includes a KRIM Shield missing its four attachment pins. Fair condition.
70	German WW II Iron Cross 1st Class. - Lot consists of an Iron Cross 1st class. The Iron Cross shows patina along its silver borders and reverse, coke style pin is stamped "107"; with cross complete with barrel hinge and "C" catch. Very good condition.
71	German WW II "Spange" for the Iron Cross 2nd class. - This lot presents a 1939 spange 2nd class displaying a patina silver finish. The reverse is complete with all four attachment pins and marked "L/12". Spange is complete with its original base ribbon (WW 1 iron cross 2nd class ribbon) and its issue envelope with "L/12" on the back. Excellent.
72	German WW II Panzer Assault badge. - This lot presents a Panzer Assault Badge finished in darkened silver, stamped hollow-back style complete with all attachment furniture. Excellent.
73	German WW II Luftschutz/RLB cap devices. - This lot consists of two different versions of cap devices both representing the "Reichluftschutzverband". One example presents an enameled RLB and swastika on a silver sunburst. Second example is the later LUFTSCHUTZE pattern large black enameled swastika over a silvered sunburst. This example is missing one of its attachment pins; the earlier example is complete. Both pieces measure 1 5/16" diameter. Very good.
74	German WW II Iron Cross 1st class. - This example displays darkened patina on its rim, reverse backing and "coke bottle" pin "L/56". Very good.
75	German WW II Infantry Assault badge. - This example presents a hollow-back style assault badge in darkened bronze. Obverse shows standard wear with the reverse complete with hinge, thin pin and "C" catch device. Very good.
76	German WW I and II ribbon bar lot and Imperial German rings. - Lot consists of eight ribbon bars both singles and double ribbon examples in addition to three Imperial era rings, two of which display the Imperial crown and one dated "1914/15". Good.
77	East German (DDR) medal group. - Lot consists of two examples of East German awards. One example is a neck order; the other is a breast medal. Both display a red enamel faced "Maltese Cross" design with gilt finish. Both complete with their respective ribbons.
78	German WW II NARVIK Shield and "tinnie" grouping. - Lot consists of five different "tinnie" examples. Also, an oxidized "NARVIK" Shield missing its four attachment prongs with three holes for attachment to the uniform. Good.

79	German WW II Kriegsmarine shoulder board group. - Lot consists of three different naval examples, two of which display a dark blue base surrounded by tresse with pips and specialty device attached. The third example is an officers shoulder board for use with the summer white uniform. Lot also includes an early style shoulder board of dark green wool displaying a machine embroidered winged shell superimposed over an anchor executed in yellow thread. This board would have been worn on the special coastal Artillery uniform. Good.
80	German WW II cloth insignia group. - Lot consists of a "WERKFEUERWEHR" auxiliary fireman's cuff title displaying silver gray machine embroidered lettering on a pink wool band. Second example presents a yellow on black BeVo embroidered band for HJ sports. Both examples test negative to UV black-light. Very good.
81	German WW II cloth insignia group. - This lot consists of one pair of Army reserve officers collar tabs displaying machine embroidered leitzen on a green backing and two different examples of Army rank chevrons. Very good.
82	German WW II Labor Corp (RAD) high officials shoulder boards. - This lot consists of a matching set of RAD officials fancy shoulder boards displaying braided gilt and silver/black bullion stitched to a off white wool base complete with matching shoulder hold down bars. These boards were inserted into an open shoulder seam employed on summer white tunics to allow removal for cleaning purposes. Reverse of both shows minor moth damage. Very rare and uncommon set. Very good.
83	German WW II Iron Cross 1st class. - This lot presents a pin back Iron Cross displaying oxidized silver rim and back plate with virtually all of its black iron core retaining its original finish. The "coke bottle" styled pin which is marked "107" is attached to a barrel type hinge with its "C" clamp intact. Very good condition.
84	German WW II medal and insignia lot. - This lot includes a 1934 Hindenburg cross with ribbon, three tinnies, a bronze drivers badge on blue gray backing. Very good condition.
85	German WW II Police 15-year service award. - Obverse of this gilt cross displays a spread wing eagle surrounded by an oval wreath all superimposed on a Maltese cross. Reverse of cross presents For true service in the Police. Medal comes with a cornflower blue moir ribbon. Apparently unissued. Excellent.
86	Soviet (USSR) medal group. - Lot consists of three examples of Soviet Commemorative medals with ribbon all commemorating the 1945 end of WW II. Complete and in excellent condition.
87	German WW II cloth and metal insignia group. - Lot includes the following; a BeVo embroidered Luftwaffe eagle, gray on blue backing, a machine embroidered Luftwaffe eagle in gray thread on green backing, a single collar tab "SHD" machine embroidered in gray thread, and an Army rank chevron on green HBT for work outfits. Lot also includes a DAF cap badge showing a BeVo embroidered cog wheel/swastika surrounded by gilt metal frame with one attachment pin and a stamped aluminum RAD enlisted cap badge. Very good.
88	German WW II/pre war tinnie grouping. - This lot of tinnies includes three metal pins, two of pressed paper (one from the Adolf Hitler center), two of plastic composition, and a cloth mothers organization dated 1934. Very good condition.
89	German WW II medal group. - This lot includes and Eastern Front medal complete with ribbon and a War Service Cross without swords complete with ribbon. Very good.
90	German WW II gilt wound badge with partial case. - This badge shows wear and oxidation retaining approximately 50% of its gilded wash. Reverse of medal is maker marked "L/63" and is equipped with a "coke bottle" pin and flat formed "C" catch. This medal comes in an original dark red leatherette case missing its lid. Good condition.
91	German WW II silver Wound Badge in partial case. - This late period example is an example of a solid back single piece cast medal displaying a silver wash finish showing striations. Reverse displays "65" in raised numerals. Medal comes with its original dark red leatherette case missing the lid. Good
92	German WW I metal eagle group. - Lot includes a wide spread wing Veteran's Association eagle (3 3/4") eagle of stamped aluminum. Reverse stamped with the numeral "2" raised above "ges. gesch.". Lot also includes a heavy well detailed gilded police style eagle attached to an oval leaf wreath. Reverse shows the remains of two attachment pins now missing. Good condition.
93	German WW II Reichwehr belt buckle. - This lot presents a stamped brass rectangular buckle with a stamped circular face showing a post WW I Weimer-style eagle central surrounded by the words "REICHSBANNER/SCHWARZ/ROT/GOLD". Evidence of period repair to the catch using a large amount of leaded material. An uncommon buckle. Good condition.
94	German WW II Iron Cross 1st Class. - This example displays typical black painted iron core center surrounded by an oxidized silver rim. Dark silver reverse displays a "coke bottle" shaped pin marked with "134" complete with catch. Very good.
95	German WW II Iron Cross 1st class. - This example presents a black iron core displaying a central swastika along with "1939" date. The darkened silver rim appears wider on this example. The reverse is fitted with a barrel hinge holding a "coke bottle" shaped pin marked "20" secured by a "C" catch. Very good.
96	German post WW I veterans association sleeve patch. - This lot presents a BeVo embroidered finely detailed helmet above a fancy shield surrounded by "L.V. GROSS-HESSSEN" in German Fracture script all BeVo embroidered on a black field. This patch was worn by a member of the German Stahlhelm organizations. Very good.
97	German WW II Army general's shoulder board. - This lot presents a single shoulder board example of a general of the German Army. The facing presents the interlaced gilt and silver braiding sewn to a red wool backing. This example displays two large silvered pips representing the rank of a full general. Shoulder board shows significant wear and is complete with a pebbled gilt screw-on shoulder button. Red backing shows wear and darkening. Good.
98	German WW II general officers collar tabs. - This lot presents a matching pair of Army General rank tabs presenting fancy Arabesque embroidery executed in the newly developed Cellon material embroidered onto a red/red-orange wool backing. The reverse stiffening material of rough tan bunting was used to hold the long narrow shape of these tabs. All elements test negative to UV/black light. Unissued mint example.
99	German WW II West Wall medals and envelopes. - This lot presents two examples of the German West Wall medal complete with ribbon, each with paper packets stamped "DEUTSCHES/SCHUTZWALL-EHRENZEICHEN" with the reverse of the envelop stamped with the makers name. Both examples in very good condition.

100	German WW II police insignia. - Lot consists of a machine embroidered police eagle and wreath in gray white thread displaying a black embroidered swastika all directly embroidered on a police green wool backing. Moth damage is noted on the right rim of the patch. Lot also includes two examples of BeVo embroidered police cap eagles both in unissued condition. Overall very good condition.
101	German WW II police officers shoulder insignia. - This example presents a fine bullion hand embroidered police eagle/wreath insignia embroidered on a black backing. This example tests negative to black light/UV exposure. Excellent.
102	German WW II "Unterofficier" green piped shoulder boards for the tropical/DAK tunic. - Facing presents a light tan base material surrounded by aluminum tresse and edged in dark green wool piping. A lighter green material was used for backing with light tan slip-on devices. Excellent.
103	German WW II collar tabs of the RWM, RKM, and OKH "superior agencies". - This matching set of collar tabs were worn by officers of the Reich Ministry of War, Armed Forces High Command, and Army High Command. These well used patches present a gold colored serrated "Litzen" with extrusions on each edge with chapel ends. Tabs are backed in what appears to be heavy brown cardboard. (See Angolia, Vol. 1 Uniforms and Traditions of the German Army.) This pattern was abolished in 1942 resulting in their rarity. Good condition.
104	German WW II photo-postcard group. - This lot includes a rare photo of Hitler and Goering carrying his field marshal baton entering the infamous railroad car at Compiene for witnessing the surrender of France in 1940. A second example is a photograph of Hitler walking asides a high ranking SA official. Very good condition.
105	German WW II photo postcard grouping. - Lot consists of photo postcards of four named Knight's Cross recipients of various Levels of the Knights Cross. Lot also includes four other examples of military postcards. In addition, lot includes a fine portrait photograph of an early NSDAP member in full uniform and early cap. Excellent condition.
106	German WW II photo group. - This lot presents a period reproduced ink on cardboard portrait of Hitler signed and dated 1940. Also a photograph of a Kriegsmarine Knight's Cross recipient, Hoffmann photo with information strip on reverse. Lot also includes five examples of German WW II death cards. Very good condition.
107	German WW II photograph and postcard lot. - Lot includes a portrait photo of a standing German soldier in full uniform. Period photo is housed in a small glass front frame. Lot also includes a postcard stamped at Nurnberg party day rally 1937 showing motorcyclists of the NSKK. Very good condition.
108	German WW II Hitler Youth photo postcard group. - Lot includes one large 7 1/4" x 5 1/4" photo of Hitler Youth members on march, two additional photo postcards showing Hitler Youth activities complete with banners. An additional photo sent from "Ceskoslovenska" shows an image of Hitler with a large group of German youth complete with his standarte on display. Very good.
109	German WW II photo/postcard group. - Lot consists of five postcard size images and five candid photos of Germans in various unit uniforms. Very good.
110	German WW II photo/postcard group. - Lot consists of seven war time images including two colored postcards showing German and Italian troops in North African Desert warfare. Very good.
111	Japanese military postcard photos and insignia group. - Lot consists of a colored Japanese postcard showing three armed service members in uniform, four personal photographs showing soldiers in uniform, two small Japanese Naval patches, one marked "Japan Navy" by the veteran, and a single Japanese Army officers collar tab. Good.
112	German WW II group of SS photographs. - This lot presents two large format (5"x7") professional photo portraits of Waffen-SS enlisted men in two variations of combat tunics. Reverse of one photo states name and rank (SS-Rottenfuhrer). Very good condition.
113	German WW II photo postcard and candid photo lot. - This group consists of six photo postcards with portrait images of Luftwaffe and Army soldiers in uniform. Very good.
114	German WW II aircraft ID booklet and DLV member's booklet. - This lot includes an unissued DLV (Deutschen Luftsport-Verband) booklet and a wartime aircraft recognition booklet. Also included are two examples of German Propaganda leaflets dropped on Allied troops entering the "Vosges", a heavily defended forest area. Very good.
115	WW II Axis forces German and Italian photo postcards. - This lot includes a portrait photo of a Hitler Youth member in a winter uniform, a Knight's Cross/oak leaves recipient, and three colored postcards displaying Italian paratroopers in full uniform. Very good condition.
116	German WW II photograph group. - Lot consists of five postcard photos of German aircraft, one propaganda color postcard depicting a ME-109 attacking a British bomber formation, and a photo card of a Luftwaffe soldier in tunic and M43 cap. Very good.
117	German WW II combat soldier photos. - Lot consists of over twenty small candid photos of German combat troops during the early war years. Most have ink notations on the reverse. Very good.
118	German WW II photo postcard group. - This lot presents six photo postcards including a "Tag der Briefmarke"-1938 Berlin cancelled card, a Waffen-SS general (By H. Hoffmann) who was a recipient of a foreign neck order, and Hitler reviewing a parade. Very good.
119	German WW II photos of identified army general. - This lot, consists of two photos of General of Artillery Muller (OKH) in full uniform with awards including the Knight's Cross, one photo of Muller with fellow officers, and an envelop addressed to General Muller. Very good.
120	German pre-WW II signed Hitler photograph. - This lot presents a photo postcard showing an image of Adolf Hitler with party leaders in early pre-war Political uniforms attending a party gathering. Reverse shows several ink stamps and what appears to be a pencil autograph of Adolf Hitler, the authenticity of which has not been confirmed. Very good.
121	German WW I "Soldbuch" and postcard group. - This lot consists of a "Soldbuch from the 2nd Company Inf. Regt. Von Brittish. This well used booklet is marked with dates up to October 1918, with numerous regimental stamps. Also included are six photo portraits of Imperial soldiers in uniform, and three images showing the carnage of WW I. Very Good.
122	German WW I soldiers books. - This lot includes two examples of German "Soldbuchs". One example shows the military record of a member of a Bavarian Infantry Battalion with entries up to early 1916. The second Soldbuch contains many entries dating to immediate post-war 1919 era. Both examples are in very good condition with many entries.

123	US Vietnam and later period Ranger insignia. - Lot consists of Ranger tallies from the 1st through the 5th batallion. All insignia is machine embroidered with "Ranger" and the "Battalion" number (1st through 5th) in white surrounded by a red border. Very good.
124	US Vietnam War era patches. - Lot consists of eight pieces of machine embroidered as well as hand stitched multicolor Vietnam War insignia. Very good.
125	US Vietnam War era Army and Air Force cloth patches. - Lot consists of nine examples of machine embroidered insignia mainly from Vietnam War era. Very good.
126	US cloth insignia group. - This lot of ten includes examples of parachute unit insignia used during WW II including one large (4 1/2" diameter) hand embroidered example showing a frogman diving on a mine with anchor and wings in the background. Lot also includes post-war patches. Very good.
127	US Vietnam era cloth patch lot. - Lot includes five examples of Vietnam War unit patches showing both machine as well as hand embroidered examples including a large golden eagle (6" wingspan) representing Navy SEALs. Very good.
128	US Vietnam War era cloth unit patches. - Lot consists of four different examples of embroidered RECON unit patches and a "RT NEVADA" patch. Very good.
129	US WW II and later unit patch group. - Lot consists of ten different examples of US Army, Navy and Air Corp unit patches, including an uncommon "Manhattan" Project patch. Very good.
130	US Vietnam War era military unit patches. - Lot includes eight different examples of both machine and hand embroidered unit insignia. One hand embroidered patch is in poor condition.
131	US Vietnam War era military unit insignia group. - This lot presents six examples of hand sewn "in country" patches representing mainly South Vietnamese units. Very good.
132	US WW II and later squadron patches. - This lot consists of the following; a variant large 508 PIR patch (5" diameter) "Red Devils" embroidered red devil figure with parachute background, tests UV negative; and three squadron patches approximately 4" diameter, including "The Roving Ravens", "Flying Badgers", and "60th Fighter Interceptor-Squadron". Very good.
133	US WW II painted leather squadron patch group. - This lot presents two hand painted leather patches representing flying squadrons during WW II. One patch depicting a horned bulldog represents the Marine Fighter Squadron unit 111. The other interesting example depicts a flying bomb out of the inner rim of this patch showing significant cracking and age wear. Unattributed squadron. One example in very good condition. One in fair condition.
134	US WW II aviation unit patches. - This lot presents a hand embroidered representation of the 14th Army Air Force (Flying Tiger) unit insignia. The attacking tiger is executed in gold bullion thread directly sewn into a dark blue backing with a lighter blue rim. The second example represents a hand painted circular leather patch (5 1/4") example displaying a leaping lion over Wake Island representing the US fighter groups stationed at Wake. Very good.
135	US WW II Army Air Corp visor cap insignia. - Lot consists of one large winged propeller device for aviation cadets and two gilded eagle devices for officers visor caps. Very good.
136	US WW II Armored unit metal insignia and patch group. - This lot presents two machine embroidered armored division patches and two sets of enlisted mans brass roundelles for armored troops and one officers collar brass insignia for armored infantry. Very good.
137	US Vietnam War era unit insignia. - This lot consists of four different machine embroidered unit patches three of which represent Vietnamese units and one patch worn by pilots flying the F-5 fighter. Very good.
138	US Vietnam War era and later cloth insignia group. - This lot consists of over twenty subdued style cloth insignia used mainly on combat jungle jackets. Very good.
139	US Vietnam War and later cloth insignia. - Lot includes five machine embroidered unit patches and over a dozen subdued type cloth insignia used with jungle jackets. Very good.
140	US WW II metal insignia lot. - Lot consists of nine examples, two matching sets, of distinctive insignia (DI's), one good conduct medal, soldier's bracelet with unit insignia, and four unit patches including tank destroyer and Manhattan Project patches. Very good.
141	US WW I patch group. - Lot consists of five examples of machine as well as hand embroidered insignia, all with felt backing. Some of the patches display a secondary gauze like material used for the final sewing foundation. Units represented include Advanced Sector, Service of Supply, 8th Corp, 1st Army (damaged), 18th Inf. Div., and the 19th Inf. Div. Very good.
142	US WW II Army Air Corp leather squadron patch. - This lot presents a circular 4" diameter white painted leather circle with two three-sided red and white "dice" sewn to the white leather backing. This patch represents the insignia of the 90th Bombardment Group, USAAF. This example displays age with some loss of paint; the stitch holes bordering the entire patch indicate use and removal from and aviator's jacket. Good condition.
143	US WW II Naval shoulder rank insignia. - This lot presents three examples of rank insignia, two of which display highly detailed silver gilt embroidered eagles over the specialty symbols, whereas a third example is machine embroidered with white thread displaying eagle over crossed cannon symbols. The bullion embroidered examples are in excellent condition but the white example is heavily mothed. Overall very good.
144	US WW II aviation squadron patch. - This shield shaped patch , 3 1/2" x 2 1/2", presents a white painted leather patch with the following all hand painted in black; a circle bracketed by two "V"s representing the WW II "Corsair" gull wing fighter is painted above a black sheep figure to its left with painted "stars" surrounding. The words BLACK SHEEP hand lettered in white paint all over a 1/2" wide diagonal bisects the patch. Bottom of patch displays the unit "VMF-214" in black paint. The entire patch is bordered by hand painted gilt edging. This patch represents the squadron insignia of the famous (or infamous) Black Sheep Squadron" headed by Gregg "Pappy" Boyington during the Pacific Theater Air Campaign. This patch is crudely hand made with indications that it was worn and removed from a jacket, however, it's age and authenticity has not been documented. Good.

145	US WW II aviation related cloth insignia. - This lot consists of two Army Air Corp patches, one VMF naval fighter squadron patch, and one 4" diameter circular patch displaying a winged lion with surrounding stars machine embroidered in yellow thread on a blue backing. Lot also includes three machine embroidered wings of white/gray thread on light tan backing representing observers wings and uncommon liaison pilots wings. Very good.
146	Unattributed military metal shoulder insignia. - This lot presents a gilded bronze shield 3 1/8" x 2 1/4" showing a gilded crown above a crest displaying a rampant lion and a fortress below which appears "11 DIV" in raised gilt letters. The background is in finely pebbled black painted metal. This device has been pierced in three positions indicating sew-on application. Very good.
147	US pre-WW II/WW II chemical corp collar insignia. - This lot consists of seven examples of gilded and enameled collar devices displaying the insignia of the US chemical corp. These uncommon insignia are complete with attachment pins which indicate officers in either WW I or pre- WW II era. Very good.
148	US WW I and WW II metal insignia group. - This lot consists of four sets of unit Distinctive Insignia (DI). Also included are five Warrant Officers devices, and four WW I and one EM collar insignia. Very good.
149	US WW II DI's and other metal grouping. - Lot includes six pairs of enamel metal distinctive insignia (DI's) and a bag of miniature military devices representing various military specialties. Excellent.
150	US WW II and later military patch group. - Lot contains sixteen examples of military patches various units representing WW II and later military units. Excellent.
151	Russian (USSR) metal device grouping. - Lot consists of seven enameled metal devices metal insignia representing various units and specialties of the Russian military. All complete and in very good condition.
152	US WW II metal DI insignia and shooting qualification badges. - Lot consists of a miscellaneous group of metal insignia including DI's, shoulder rank insignia and Army qualification medals. Good.
153	US cased Purple Heart medal, - This lot consists of an unnamed Purple Heart medal with attached ribbon, its matching ribbon bar with a number "4" attachment and lapel pin all in a named case. This group was purchased with a 4th Armored Division patch. Very good.
154	US cased Purple Heart. - This lot presents a cased Purple Heart named to the recipient and includes a matching ribbon bar and lapel pin all residing in a Purple Heart case. Excellent condition.
155	US Military aviation cloth embroidered patches. - This lot consists of two large machine embroidered patches, one (6" x 4 3/4") depicts a helmeted knight electronically viewing the earth, below "tally" reads "AIRANTISUBRON 935". The second example (3 1/2" x 4") depicts a helmeted owl holding a bomb in its beak and clutching a machine gun, with "SEMPER ADAPTATI" above. These cloth insignia were normally worn on the left breast of the flight jacket. Uncommon US patches. Very good condition.
156	US military unit aviation embroidered cloth patches. - This lot consists of three machine embroidered aviation patches. One example, 5" x 5 1/2", depicts a buzzard-type bird residing on a branch with "CVAN 65" and "CVW 14" and "DEC-19, 1974" surrounding it. Above the central blue globe is "TONKIN GULF/BRAZEN PROVOCATOR" and "ABOUT 50 "SABRE RATTLING" MISSIONS" (Flyboy humor!). The second example shows four engined bomber profiles over the USA with an embroidered eye in the center. The third patch depicts possibly air-to-ground support aircraft patrolling over a US Jeep. All well executed, colorful and uncommon older insignia.
157	US WW II Army Air Corp pilot/air crew issue survival silk maps. - This lot consists of two highly detailed maps of Japan printed on thin silk and issued to pilots and air crew flying over enemy territory. Very good condition.
158	US Army Air Corp issue "Blood Chit". - This example, measuring 11 3/4" x 9 1/4", of silk printed with an American flag below which are explanations in multiple languages, (French, Thai, Chinese, Korean, etc.). The statement identifies the bearer as an American aviator, an enemy of Japan and that payment would be given for his safe conduct. This example is serial numbered in red numerals. Very good.
159	US WW II cased Purple Heart medal. - Medal is unnamed and in excellent condition, complete with ribbon, early style ribbon bar, and lapel pin. The case may be post WW II. Very good.
160	US WW II Army Air Corp issued map and manual grouping. - This lot consists of a detailed map of Japan and South China Sea area printed on thin silk to be carried by pilots and air crew when flying over enemy territory. Lot also includes a pilot's instrument check booklet, a Martin power gun turret manual, and a post war restricted manual (dated 1948) on the then new airborne "LORAN" electronic navigation system. Map edge is frayed, booklets in very good condition. Good condition.
161	German WW II S 84/98(k) Kriegsmarine issued rifle bayonet. - Bayonet is stamped with 4 digit Ser. No.; reverse side displays an early commercial mark "Coppel G.M.B.H." (Alexander Coppel), best known for its high quality dress daggers. Serial numbers on blade and scabbard are matching. Blade spine is dated "40" (1940). The cross guard displays the Kriegsmarine issue number. with stylized N (Nordsee) 19524. Pommel has multiple WAA 253 Waffenamt stamps. The grip/cross guard elements as well as the blade retain most of its semi-high polish finish, standard on Kriegsmarine issued sidearms. Scabbard also displays its bright blue finish with small, light indents on reverse. Bayonet is equipped with a black leather frog in excellent condition; the reverse of which is properly stamped with the KM "stick wing" eagle/M issue mark. A rare 98K bayonet in VG+ condition.
162	German WW II /pre-war S84/98K rifle bayonet; code S/241. - This example of an early Nazi era rifle bayonet is stamped with the secret/unidentified code "S/241", with its four digit ser. No. which matches the scabbard. Spine is stamped "36" (1936). Dark brown composition grips are excellent. Grip, pommel, and cross guard retain virtually all of its original blue finish. Blade rates 85-90% blue with apparent wear only at tip. Excellent blued dent-free scabbard is equipped with an excellent condition light brown leather frog, usually attributed to Luftwaffe issue. Overall excellent.
163	German WW II S84/98(k) rifle bayonet; W.K.C. - This example displays only the "W.K.C." (Weyersburg) stamp and 3 digit serial number which matches the scabbard serial number. No Waffenamt stamps are visible, typical of Nazi-era commercial production 98k bayonets. Sidearm is equipped with dark brown composition grips showing some wear but no damage, Bright blue blade retains about 85% of its original blue finish. Blued scabbard shows some dark oxidation, devoid of dents. Bayonet is equipped with an unmarked black leather frog with early cross strap still in place. Overall condition VG

164	German WW II S84/98(k) rifle bayonet. - This late was example shows a rough finish on its mint blued blade. Ricasso is stamped "44 fnj" with a 4 digit serial number/waffenamt matched to the dull blued steel scabbard. Medium brown composite grips show little or no wear. Scabbard is complete with an unmarked black leather frog equipped with a leather cross-strap. About mint.
165	German/Prussian rifle bayonet reissued during the Nazi era. - This interesting example of a S84/98 bayonet saw long-term use, as evidenced by the stamps observed on the blade and cross guard. The bayonet was manufactured in 1918 by the J,A, Henckels (double-man logo) Company, reworked and re-issued in accordance with the Weimer "1920" compliance stamp on the reverse cross guard. The unit stamping also on the cross guard "2.7.K.7.73" indicate reissue to an Army unit, through the 1930s. Stained wood grips are in very good condition; all metal finishes of grip area, blade as well as blued steel scabbard retain much of their original finish. Oversized serial stamps match those on the scabbard. Black leather scabbard with cross strap is in very good condition. Uncommon bayonet in very good condition.
166	German WW II KS 98 Fire Service dress bayonet. - This example shows the nickeled grip and black checkered grips typical of these dress sidearm's. However the "Feuerwehr" example was fitted with a recurved cross guard, and was devoid of an attachment slot. The bright nickeled blade without maker logo measures 25 cm. The black painted scabbard is excellent and complete with black leather frog and attached fire service crimson/silver portopee. Overall excellent condition.
167	German WW II KS 98 dress bayonet with acid-etched blade. - This example presents nickele grip/pommel/cross guard elements with black checkered grip plates. However, one side of its 25 cm length blade bears a finely acid-etched section stating "In remembrance of my service in Infantry Rgt. 87" flanked by oak leaves, national emblem and combat helmet. Blade ricasso displays the Alcoso "Balance" logo. Red (artillery) felt insets shows nothing. Scabbard paint is excellent with black patent leather frog attached. Overall very good condition.
168	German WW II KS 98 dress bayonet. - This example displays a full nickeled hilt with black checkered grip plate in very good condition. The 25 cm bright nickeled blade, bears the uncommon logo/trademark of Klittermann & Moog/Solingen. Scabbard paint shows some "spidering" but no loss. Complete with a black patent leather frog. Very good condition.
169	German WW II KS 98 dress bayonet. - This example is equipped with the officer's grade short (20 cm) nickeled blade displaying the logo of Gustav Spitzer/Solingen. The bayonet displays nickel hilt elements with undamaged black checkered grips. Slot retains its red (Artillery) felt insert. Scabbard paint shows about 50% loss, but is dent free, complete with black patent leather frog. Very good condition.
170	German WW II KS 98 dress bayonet. - This officer grade example is equipped with a 25 cm "false edge" type blade, displaying the logo of Paul Seilheimer/Solingen. All nickeled parts, including the bright blade are in excellent condition, as are the black checkered grip plates. Complete with excellent black leather frog. Excellent condition.
171	German WW II Police dress bayonet. - This example displays finely detailed eagle head pommel with oak leaf cross guards. Fine bone grip plates display an aluminum police eagle affixed to the obverse plate; two aluminum domed rivets hold the grip plates on the hilt. Nickeled, fullered blade measures 13" factory shortened from original earlier "clam shell" model. Blade is stamped with an early large double oval/Carl Eickhorn-Solingen. Reverse of cross guard is stamped "P.S. 86". Top scabbard fitting is stamped "S.SCH.I.310". Black leather scabbard is complete with leather frog and correct Police portopee with no splitting or damage to the leather body. Overall very good condition.
172	German WW II KS 98 dress bayonet with acid-etched blade. - This short pattern officer grade dress bayonet has a 7 7/8" nickeled blade, one side is acid-etched with a central long, straight winged eagle below which is the statement "In remembrance of my service" bracketed by fancy interwound line designs. The design is known to have been used by the firm Anton Wingen, and the blade is so stamped with the company standing knight/A.W.Jr. logo. Blade rates very good, grip fittings show wear with closed crack on one grip plate. Scabbard complete with a tan (Luftwaffe) leather frog. Overall good condition.
173	German WW II Red Cross hewer. - This example of the Deutsche Rotes Kreuz NCO side arm shows slightly darkened/gray pommel, cross guard, and scabbard fittings black checkered composition grip plates show little wear and no damage. Heavy, blunt nosed, saw tooth blade is about mint, and is unmarked, as is typical of this sidearm. Scabbard paint shows breakthrough oxidation except underneath the correct black leather frog. A veteran cut a hole on the reverse for display purposes. Overall very good.
174	German WW II M1934 NSKK dress dagger. - This example bears the blade trademark of E. & F. Horster. Dagger and scabbard are equipped with nickel fittings. Brown wood grip with nickel eagle is devoid of chips. Blade appears to have been polished but without damage or pitting. Scabbard retains most of its black (NSKK) enamel finish. Overall good condition.
175	German WW II NSKK transitional model dress dagger. - This example displays nickel plated fittings throughout. Grip is devoid of any chips or damage. The blade bears the duel marks Wilhelm Wagner/Solingen-Merscheid and the RZM M7/25 designation, hence the term transition model. Blade shows some small edge nicks, but is generally in good condition. An uncommon maker. Very good condition.
176	German WW II NSKK transitional model dress dagger. - This example displays all plated fittings in fine original polish on the dagger and scabbard. Bright blade is dual transitional period marked with the famous Carl Eickhorn squirrel logo as well as the company RZM designation, RZM M7/66. The scabbard retains virtually all of its original black enamel finish. Complete with black leather hanger. Excellent overall condition.
177	German WW II Hitler Youth /Deutsche Jugend service knife. - This dagger is identical to the standard HJ example with two exceptions; the black checkered grip displays a metal single "sigrune" over a red translucent base plate inset into the grip plate instead of the standard HJ diamond, and the scabbard is nickeled (old) instead of black enamel. The thin blade is devoid of any marks. Leather hanger cross strap shows evidence of repair. An uncommon knife attributed to the German Youth organization. Neither the nickel grip/hilt fittings nor nickel plated scabbard show evidence of any cleaning or polishing. Good condition.
178	German WW II Red Cross (DRK) officer's dress dagger. - This dagger shows pommel, cross-guard, and scabbard fittings unique to this model. All metal is nickel plated showing wear mainly to the pommel. Cross-guard shows its original muted nickel finish with fine detail. Nickel plated steel scabbard is dent free, showing spots of darkening. The orange grip is devoid of cracks or chips. The bright nickeled blade rates excellent. Dagger comes complete with an original correct set of uncommon strap hangers. Overall in very good condition.

179	German WW II M33 SS (Schutzstaffel) dress dagger. - This dagger displays features characteristic of mid-to-later war period edged weapons. All hilt and scabbard fittings are nickel plated examples. The grip shows the thin, curved profile and oxidized aluminum grip eagle common to these examples. The grip displays a fine, undamaged SS signet with no damage to the wood. Lower cross guard is devoid of any marks. The blade presents the acid-etched marks, "RZM" within circle, "941/40 SS", on reverse, attributed to the Carl Eickhorn firm, as well as, the etched SS motto on the obverse. Poorer quality blade finish compared to earlier period pieces is evident. However acid-etching is clear and deep with no indication of buffing. Scabbard paint shows age "spidering" but retains virtually all original finish. Complete with a "SS/RZM" stamped issued short leather hanger equipped with a proper stamped "RZM/OLC/M5/71" belt clip. Very nice example of a mid-period SS dagger. Very good condition.
180	German WW II Luftwaffe 2nd model officer dagger. - This dagger presents well detailed pommel, cross guard and ferrel hilt elements surrounding a fine off/ivory white wire-wrapped grip without damage. Blade displays its original polish and is the unmarked type. (Many unmarked blade tangs are marked, allowing manufacturer identification.) Darkened scabbard body is dent free and is equipped with one replacement band with ring clearly period made. Very nice example, complete with dress hangers. Overall very good condition.
181	German WW II Red Cross (DRK) NCO hewer. - This example of a Deutsche Rotes Kreuz sidearm displays the muted gray finished nickel plated fittings comprising the single piece cast hilt as well as the scabbard fittings. Black checkered grip plates are fine and devoid of damage; retaining screws show oxidation. Pommel shows lifting/oxidation on obverse. Bright, typically unmarked saw-tooth blade with blunt end rates excellent. Black enamel painted scabbard shows mainly edge wear but retains most of its original painted finish. This side-arm is equipped with a wide black leather frog, the reverse of which is maker stamped. overall very good condition with exception of front pommel area.
182	German WW II Falschirmjager/Paratrooper combat utility knife. - A unique design utility knife carried in a special pouch on the paratrooper's jump smock. Contrary to most well designed German weapons, this knife suffered from a weak attachment system to the knife body. Many snapped during use or after capture. This example displays a period replacement locking spring which is superior to the original. The blade is mostly untouched except for a half-hearted attempt at sharpening. Blade displays the sword within oval logo of the Paul Weyersburg/Solingen Company. The "Rostfrei" mark indicates that this blade is forged from stainless steel. One wood grip shows fire damage; the opposite side is fine. An interesting example in good overall condition.
183	German WW II K98k rifle bayonet - unmarked. - This 98k bayonet presents excellent high-polish blue hilt fittings with excellent hard wood grips showing little wear. The original high polish blue finish on the blade is in excellent condition. Of interest, neither the blade ricasso nor pommel bear any stamps, unlike virtually all 98k bayonets. The fine blued steel scabbard is stamped "S/185K" and "326". The 1934 "K" code is consistent with the early high quality finish throughout. A rare early code. Excellent condition.
184	Japanese WW II rifle bayonet. - This Type 30"hook guard" example displays wear/use on hilt fittings and wood grip plates. The deep blued fullered blade bears the stamp of the Nagoya armory. Blued steel scabbard shows several depressions, retaining most of its finish. Scabbard is complete with a well used leather frog. Very good condition.
185	US WW I M 1917-18 trench knife and leather scabbard. - This original example displays much of its original blue finish on the "Knuckle bow" guard, and 9"triangular blade. The guard is stamped "U.S./L.F.&C." (Landers Frary & Clark), and "1917". Blackened steel fittings mounted on green leather scabbard body is in very good condition. This knife shows the name "Bobby" cut into the walnut grip. The trench knife was carried by Robert "Bobby" Reich, a member of the 4th US Armored Division. Very good condition.
186	US WW I model 1910 bolo and scabbard. - This example is equipped with a 10 3/4" blued blade, blued steel cross guard and pommel with dark walnut grips. All elements retain much original finish without damage. Blade is stamped "PLUMB" (weak)/St. Louis/1918. Light tan canvas covered wood scabbard with hold-down clip ends in a heavy leather tip, stamped "Bauer Bros., 1917". A fine example of the type. Very good.
187	US WW I Springfield rifle bayonet. - This example retains its full 15 3/4" dull blue blade bearing the stamps "U.S.", "SA"/ordnance stamp/1918" and serial number. Blade edge shows evidence at a weak attempt at sharpening. Composition green scabbard retains most of its finish with a side chip on one edge. Steel scabbard "lip" is stamped "U.S./Ordnance Flaming Ball/U.S.". Overall very good.
188	US WW II M-1 Garand bayonet. - This example is fitted with a 9 3/4" spear point blade displaying most original green parkerized finish. Blade is marked "A.F.H./Ordnance Ball/U.S." black plastic grips show no damage. Green composition scabbard is very good with small paint smear at tip near hold-down tie. Very Good.
189	US WW II M3 fighting knife. - Lot consists of a M-3 fighting knife with stamped "US M3/CASE" under the steel cross guard. Blade retains about 30% Parkerizing but no damage. Stacked leather grips are in very good condition. Knife equipped with a standard U.S. M8 composition scabbard. Very good condition.
190	US WW II M 3 fighting knife. - This example is stamped "US M 3/PAL" under cross guard. Blade retains most of its gray parkerized finish. Stacked leather grips are very good. Knife is equipped with a standard US M 8 composition scabbard. Very good.
191	US M4 carbine bayonet. - Bayonet presents a 6 5/8" spear point blade retaining about 70% finish. Cross guard is stamped "US M4 /IMPERIAL" on bottom of cross guard. Stacked leather washer grip shows use but no damage. The functional spring-loaded pommel cap is stamped "Sp". Bayonet is equipped with a standard US M8 green composition scabbard. Good condition.
192	US M5 M-1 Garand rifle bayonet. - This example, similar to the M4 model, displays a 6 3/4" length blade showing some sharpening with "U.S.M5" and "IMPERIAL" stamped under the thick steel cross guard. The checkered black composition grip plates house the locking system for rifle attachment. Equipped with a standard US M8 A1 composition scabbard. Very good condition.
193	US M4 German made carbine bayonet. - This interesting and uncommon example presents a variation of the US made bayonets. The blade is essentially the same as US mfg. However, modifications include the thick, blued steel cross guard and brown two piece plastic grips differ from the US version. The bayonet appears devoid of any marks. The scabbard presents with a wood grain T, lock, without any US marks and retains its rawhide tie-down cords. Interesting variation. Very good condition.
194	US M4 M-1 carbine bayonet - Japanese mfg. - This lot presents an interesting and very uncommon variation of the M4 bayonet. Manufactured in Japan by "KIFFE/JAPAN", the near mint blade is high-polish blue with blued cross guard and pommel cap. The stacked leather type grip is near mint, as is the green composition scabbard it lip stamped "U.S.M8A1/TWB". About mint.
195	US "KA-BAR" style fighting knife. - Identical to the U.S.M.C "Ka-bar" but marked only with "U.S./CONETTA", the maker's mark. Full length "Bowie" style blade with partial fuller. Steel cross guard and pommel show age and oxidation. Stacked leather grip is in used, but good condition without damage. Fighting knife is housed in a plain leather scabbard, sewn and riveted construction. Good condition.

196	US WW II marine "Ka-bar" fighting knife. - This example presents a classic "U.S.M.C./KA-BAR" blade marked fighting knife. Classic Bowie-style blade retains virtually all of its original finish with slight rust line at the cross guard. Cross guard and pommel retain most of their original finish. The stacked leather type grip rates near mint. Knife is housed in a light tan leather scabbard with steel staple reinforcements. Overall an excellent example of this Marine knife. Excellent condition.
197	US WW II "Ka-bar" style fighting knife. - This example is identical to the well-known Ka-bar, except it is manufactured by and marked "CAMILLUS, NY" and "U.S.M.C." under the cross guard. The 12" Bowie-style blade retains most of its original blue finish, as does the cross guard and pommel cap. Stacked leather type grip is in excellent condition. Fighting knife is housed in a light tan unmarked leather scabbard reinforced with metal staples. Excellent condition.
198	US WW II "Ka-Bar style fighting knife. - This example presents a Ka-Bar style fighting knife marked "Camillus NY" and "U.S.M.C." on the cross guard. The unmarked blade shows evidence of sharpening, retaining about 40-50% of its original finish. Cross guard and pommel cap show light oxidation and stacked leather grip is in excellent condition. Fighting knife is housed in a light tan unmarked leather scabbard reinforced with metal staples. Very good condition.
199	US Vietnam-period issued fighting knife. - This example presents a "Ka-bar"-style fighting knife, blade marked "US/CAMILLUS NY" The blade shows use, with about 70% of the original finish remaining. Cross guard shows some oxidation, with one side bent up away from blade, stacked leather style grip remains in very good condition. Of interest is the leather, metal reinforced scabbard, the reverse of which is deeply scratched "DA NANG VIETNAM/1966-1967" with an unreadable name. Overall good condition.
200	US WW II era theater made miniature fighting knife. - This lot presents a hand made knife made in the style of a US fighting knife. Dimensions are: Overall: 6 3/4", Blade length: 3 3/4". The spear point blade appears hand made from sheet metal, left unfinished. The grip is made with stacked aluminum and plastic washers, ground and polished into a semi oval. Cross guard is formed of this aluminum, ending with a flat round brass pommel. Just below pommel cap is stamped "SYDNEY" (Australia) . Knife is housed in a hand made leather scabbard. Interesting WW II era souvenir knife in very good condition.
201	US WW II Army Air Force folding emergency survival machete. - This interesting example presents an emergency machete equipped with a wide (maximum of 2") blued blade stamped "IMPERIAL/PROV. RI" on the ricasso. The blade folds into a heavy 7" long checkered black plastic grip. The blade houses in a steel protrusion protecting the blade and holder. This machete is housed in a purpose built leather scabbard with push button flap. Issued initially to WW II Army Air Corp pilots and air crew. N.B.: Exercise caution handling this item.. Very good Condition.
202	US WW II US Navy issued Ka-bar" fighting knife. - This example of the US Navy issued fighting knife is essentially identical to the Marine (USMC) issued knife. The "Bowie" style blade is stamped "U.S.N." on one side, with the opposite side stamped with the famous "KA-BAR" logo. All metal parts including blade, cross guard and pommel retain virtually all of the flat blue finish, with minor oxidation on the cross guard where it meets the grip. The light brown stacked leather washer type grip displays all of its original polish finish. The letter "G" has been carefully ink printed on the grip near the cross guard. The light tan leather scabbard marked "C. G.G." on reverse in ink remains in excellent condition. A fine example of the type. Excellent condition.
203	Japanese WW II type 30 rifle bayonet. - Bayonet is equipped with a 15 1/2" straight, fullered blade, retaining 60-70% of the original blue, without damage. Blued hook cross guard, pommel, and grip elements are high polish blue surrounding light brown wood plates. Blade ricasso is stamped with the Nagoya Arsenal mark. Blued steel scabbard shows darkened spots, but retains over 90% of its original blue finish. Complete with original complete leather frog. Overall very good.
204	Japanese WW II type 30 rifle bayonet. - This example differs from the previous example (Lot #203) in that the cross guard is straight without a hook. The 15 1/2" straight, fullered blued blade rates about mint as do all elements of the grip metal and wood plates. Scabbard body shows several depressions on a finely blued surface. Blade ricasso presents stamps on the Toyada Loom Works under Nagoya supervision. Overall mint.
205	French M1866 Chassepot sword bayonet. - This model was commonly used on the rather short barreled rifle. Reverse curved blade measures 22 1/2"; spine is dated 1874 employed into WW I solid brass grip, pushbutton slot release and large hook cross guard. Steel scabbard retains virtually all of its dark blue finish, without dents. Overall very good condition.
206	German WW II Kriegsmarine dress dagger. - This example displays solid brass eagle, pommel and cross guards, with an off-white wire-wrapped grip showing minor cracks. The polished brass scabbard is without damage or dents. The blade shows a later period Carl Eickhorn logo, has evidence of buffing with some loss of its original acid etching. Fair condition.
207	German WW II NSDAP "Party" banner. - This double-sided banner displays dimensions of 21"x15"; a desirable and uncommon size. Banner presents a large black swastika printed upon a white circle which is machine stitched to a red field. Excellent condition.
208	German WW II NSDAP tri-color fringed "streamer". - This lot presents a 45" long "streamer" (90" full length) made of three sewn bands of red/white/black cotton (8" width). Banner has one brocade strip sewn to its top, with each end terminating with a 2 1/2" length of gold fringe. These streamers would be hung from the top of flag poles as additional decoration to parade flags. Unusual item. Very good condition.
209	German WW II Kriegsmarine flag. - Flag, measuring 66"x38", presents a mint example of a well marked German Naval flag, with typical large "stick" eagle over large "M" black stamps on the bunting edge. Reichs?fig 1.0x1.7" and "KRESS ST. TONIS" within a rectangle. This flag was taken from a German submarine in Brest (France) harbor by the veteran. Excellent/mint condition.
210	WW II Imperial Japanese forces "Rising Sun" flag. - This example presents a fine silk flag measuring 28"x35". Vividly displays a central red ball with alternating red and white stripes of increasing width spreading outward to the flags edges in stark symbolism. The flag retains both leather re-inforced corners holding attachment ties. Excellent undamaged condition.
211	Japanese WW II captured/GI named combat flag. - This example of printed cotton shows the central red ball "meatball" on white field style Japanese battle flag. However, the names and addresses of the American soldiers who captured the flag surround the red circle. All markings are in black ink and readable. This unit's members were mainly from the East Coast, but most areas of the US are represented. Attachment cords remain in place. A very interesting war trophy. Very good condition.
212	German WW II NSDAP/Political auto fender pennant. - This example presents a double sided pennant with large black swastika machine embroidered to a white circular field, all machine embroidered on a heavy wool rectangular field measuring 14"x8". One short side is opened where the stiffening metal bands would normally be placed. This structure would have kept the pennant unruffled on the fender. Pennant shows minor mothing and color loss. Very good condition.

213	German WW II Labor Front (DAF) fancy parade banner. - This double sided parade banner displays a central large (31: diameter) white bordered black cogwheel surrounding a large mobile black swastika on white field, all individual pieces machine applied to a red wool banner (53 1/2" x 46"). A unit "patch" (8 1/4" x 6 3/4") displays "ROTTEBURG-MALLERSDORF" executed in their white cable-stitch upon a dark brown velvet base, rimmed in 1/2" black ribbon. The banner still retains its original nickel "O" rings for attachment to the flag pole. Three sided of the parade banner are bordered with 2" of silver-aluminum fringe. The white segments show dirt and minor discoloration. The red wool body shows scattered moth damage. Good condition.
214	German WW II "DEUTSCHE ARBEIT FRONT" (DAF) parade banner for the city of Coburg. - This fancy double sided multi-piece banner was used in para-military parades to represent the marching German workers organization, as period films document. The banner presents a large white bordered black cog-wheel surrounding large mobile black swastika on a circular white field. The upper left corner displays this DAF's designation/location "Coburg 13" in white cable stitch directly embroidered onto light brown wool field surrounded by a large blue 3/8" thick border. Three sides of this banner are edged in 2" silver-aluminum fringe. The ring attachments are absent. The city of Coburg was an important historical locale for the rising NSDAP similar to Nurnburg. Some mothing is evident. Very good condition.
215	German WW II NSDAP banner. - This banner displays typical dimensions (12' x 4') used for static building adornment during parades. This double sided banner presents a white circle (28" diameter) with printed large black swastika on each side machine sewn to the large red cotton rectangle. This banner shows some evidence of typical fading from its outdoor use days, but no damage except when it was mounted for horizontal pole display. Very good condition.
216	German WW II signals/communications field banner. - This lot presents a red wool "banner" (actually a sign) used to show the location of German Army Field Communication Centers. The banner, measuring 17 7/8" x 16 1/4", displays a large white lightening bolt printed on both sides of this double-sided banner. The banner is attached top and bottom to two wood split dowels, sandwiching the cloth and secured by small nails or pins. The banner is hung using a tan leather tab stamped with a RB number, banner retains its original ties. A rare German Army field banner. Very good condition.
217	Japanese WW II combat flag. - This lot presents an Imperial Japanese Forces (IJF) combat flag captured on one of the Japanese held Pacific Islands. The silk flag, measuring 40" x 30", displays a central large red ball printed on an off-white field. The flag also shows four large characters penned in black ink. In addition, the lower right corner presents a fine rendering of a flowering branch and a large coral-colored chrysanthemum, representing the seal of Imperial Japan. Very good condition.
218	German "Nazi" Period Sport Organization flag. - This uncommon flag was flown on ships whose owners had to be members of a National Socialist Organization. Wool flag is printed with a large (5 1/2") black swastika within a white circle superimposed over a black anchor in white surround. Flag measures 9 1/2" x 12" with bunting and ties. Flag shows mothing and red color bleed. Fair condition.
219	US WW II era fancy AEF window hanger. - This uncommon example displays a blue (faded) felt banner (15 1/2" l. x 12 1/2") with large (1 3/4") red felt letters "A.E.F" (American Expeditionary Forces) above "HOME AGAIN" formed from white felt. A 48 star American flag (5 1/4" x 4") is sewn to the felt banner with sewn flagpole and streamers. Bottom of banner has a red trimmed frame surrounding a period photo of a US "doughboy" between "OUR BOY" in individual sewn red felt. A very interesting WW I victory item. Good condition.
220	German WW II NSDAP banner. - This lot consists of a large NSDAP party banner measuring 120" x 58". A large printed black swastika within a white circle machine sewn to the red banner. This example is double sided. Some indication of sun bleaching and several tears where the banner was mounted on a display pole. Good condition.
221	US WW I patriotic banner group. - This lot consists of three black cloth flags (9" x 12") displaying a well worn goat with "We've got the Kaiser's goat" in white, complete with their original 34" thin wood flag poles. Very good.
222	US WW II Marine Corp banner. - This example presents a 17 1/2" x 18 1/2" single-sided blue silk-like banner centrally displaying the Marine Corp fowled anchor and globe insignia. Above this is machine embroidered "Semper Fidelis" and "U.S. Marines" below . Banner is trimmed with gilt fringe at its bottom. Some discoloration to the blue field and one is 1/2" hole evident. Complete with hanging pole and gilt cord. Good condition.
223	US WW II triangular military training camp pennants. - This lot consists of five different pennants from various training camps situated throughout the US previous to and during WW II. These colorful pennants represent the US Army including one leather on felt example representing the Army Air Corp. All examples display age fading but are is sound condition. Good.
224	US WW I "Doughboy"Helmet with "69th Division" painted insignia. - Lot presents a WW I helmet with now uncommon complete liner and chinstrap. Right side has the 2 3/8" diameter painted blue and gray insignia of the 69th Division AEF. Exterior shows rust on exterior surfaces. Interior presents a mustard green painted finish. Very good condition.
225	US WW II tanker's special combat helmet. - This helmet was purpose designed by the US military for wear by armored crew members. The green composite shell is fully lined with a light tan leather liner. Two side flaps cover the ears and head including open areas for insertion of head phones. Marker's mark and size are ink stamped on back/neck piece. Pull down leather covered springs on each side are in place. Not one of the recently found warehouse examples, this item appears to have seen service. Very good condition.
226	US/British Mark 1 Brodie steel combat helmet. - This helmet, representing one of the many Brodie variations, appears to have seen service during WW II. Exterior surface presents about 60-70% tan paint which originally extended over the metal rim. The dark leather liner is intact as is the rubber donut at the dome, attached to the shell by use of a large screw. The spring-loaded tan chinstrap is complete . Exterior dome area shows multiple small dents. Uncommon and possibly desert use. Good condition,
227	US Gulf War era Gentex helicopter pilot's helmet. - This example presents a 1991 dated Gentex Corporation helicopter pilot's helmet. The hard shell helmet shell displays two pronounced side "bulges" housing the interior avionics. Interior is complete with all straps and interior lining, including input plug-in wires. The exterior mounted eye shield and micropone are in place. The back of this green finished helmet is template white paint sprayed "13/AVN SEC/187th INF. BDE." (Aviation Section, 187th Infantry Brigade). In addition to the very active Vietnam battle history, the 187th "RAKKASSANS" conducted the deepest air assault penetration into enemy territory accomplished during the Gulf War. This helmet is in excellent condition.
228	US Kevlar combat helmet. - This helmet, made by Devil's Lake Sioux Mfg. and so marked, was standard issue from the mid-1980s into the mid-2000s. Thi helmet is complete with all interior webbing/straps and is equipped with a desert tri-color type fabric cover. This helmet is missing its chinstraps. Very good condition.

229	US WW II USAAF air cadet visor cap with hat box. - This hat presents a fine quality air cadet visor cap accompanied by a circular cardboard container/hat box. The hat is of chocolate brown wool with a dark blue mohair band. The hat is fitted with a brown leather chinstrap which matches the frontal leather visor. The internal liner, sweatband, and dome sweat-shield remain in fine condition. The round hat carry container displays the name of the maker or retailer. Excellent condition.
230	German WW II Luftwaffe EM/NCO visor cap of signals. - This example presents a visored cap of gray blue wool with tan piping representing the Luftwaffe Signal Corp. Exterior shows several small moth holes; however, most of the wool body is intact without damage or wear. Stamped aluminum Luftwaffe eagle cochade, and chin strap are in place. Interior leather sweatband shows some weak areas but remains complete and supple. Sweat diamond is complete with markings visible but unreadable. The visor and chin-strap show evidence of age crazing. Very good.
231	German WW II Luftwaffe EM/NCO visor cap of the artillery. - This example presents a red-piped Luftwaffe visor cap in very fine condition. Exterior shows little or no wear, with stamped metal eagle, cochade, chin-strap and visor in excellent condition. Interior sweat band, liner and sweat diamond are intact showing little wear. The maker's logo "LEPARO" which includes a fascimilie of a visor cap is visible beneath the sweat diamond. A fine example of the type. Excellent condition.
232	Japanese WW II pilot's leather flight helmet. - This example of a Japanese WW II (and pre-war) leather flight helmet presents a dark brown flight helmet formed of eight leather pieces (some scuffing is evident on the dome). The helmet is equipped with two hard leather "cups" for avionics and protection. The fur liner is in very good condition. The interior of one ear cup displays several oval Japanese stamps; both cups are marked with the name of the American who captured this war souvenir. All chin and other exterior straps are intact and sound. A leather star within a 1 1/8" circle is sewn to the front of the helmet. Very good condition.
232A	German WW II Luftwaffe air crew flight helmet. - This leather flight helmet is complete with all straps and has a maker's tag sewn to the interior. Excellent condition.
233	WW I Imperial German leather spiked helmet. - This example presents a German WW I enlisted ranks spiked helmet used during the early years of WW I. The formed black leather body has a front and rear sewn leather "visor". The helmet exterior displays a pewter-gray finished spike attached to a round gray metal circle, gray metal stiffeners front and rear, and a large metal spread-wing eagle with "Koenig", "FR", and "For God and Germany" across its chest. Two helmet studs hold both the red/white/black rosettes as well as the leather chin strap. Interior is complete and appears sound. Good condition.
234	WW I Imperial German leather spiked helmet. - The helmet presents a formed black leather body with all attached pewter gray finished metal, including spike and base. Front and rear extension stiffeners/trim, and frontal Imperial eagle are in place. The two side studs hold both the red/white/black and black/white rosettes in place as well as the leather chin-strap. The interior liner is intact, but shows dryness and evidence of some repair. The frontal metal trim piece has rusted through, extending about 1-2". Fair condition.
235	WW II German M 35 double decal Kriegsmarine combat helmet. - This very uncommon example presents a M-35 issue double-decal Naval helmet with its original light "pea" green paint mostly covered by a coat of period heavy brush painted dark green brown paint. Both original decals remain in place with obvious effort not to overpaint these insignia. Left side of helmet presents a true gilt Naval eagle decal with over 95% remaining intact, showing excellent definition. Opposite side presents the tri-color red/white/black decal with over 85% retention. Very good interior leather liner resides on a M-40 style metal band, the original liner being replaced probably during re-issue. Interior dark green paint lacks any evidence of brush strokes, as does the exterior. Complete with chin-strap, this uncommon helmet was most probably issued to the Kriegsmarine Coastal Artillery Unit soldiers. Very good condition.
236	WW II German early Fire Police service helmet. - This interesting example displays a semi-matte black painted civilian type shell showing its distinctive duel air vents shell design. This helmet retains most of its police-style eage decal as well as the large white swastika decal, both sharply tilted forward toward the helmet visor. This type of decal application was only used during the pre-war years. Helmet also displays a large aluminum "comb" employed as added head protection. The black painted interior presents a leather dome pad in addition to the nine leather tongues comprising the liner system. Helmet is complete with its wide black chin-strap. Very good condition.
237	German WW II M-42 Luftwaffe white camouflaged combat helmet. - This example presents a M-42 (raw edge) combat helmet showing its original dark blue paint beneath a brush applied layer of (now) off-white camouflage paint. The original Luftwaffe eagle was not over painted, and is intact, but dark. Interior shows the original dark blue finish with rust spots. Leather liner is complete and remains in dirty but supple condition. Complete with somewhat dry but complete chinstrap. Very good condition.
238	German WW II Army M-40 single decal helmet. - This example displays the dark semi-rough finish of the later war helmets, with most wear seen on the dome. The silver Army decal shows some wear but is 85% intact. Interior liner and chin strap are dark but complete and supple. The interior back shield displays a neatly hand-painted name "O. Gefr. Fressmann" in now yellowed white paint. Very good condition.
239	German WW II Army M-35 single decal re-issued Army combat helmet. - This helmet shows a M-35 type steel shell retains most of the dark rough paint scheme applied during factory re-issue. The eagle decal displays a yellowish tint, but is believed to be an Army decal. Careful examination of the right side reveals evidence of a (tri-color) decal oversprayed during refurbishing, now cracking the sprayed paint. Interior liner is light tan residing on a zinc metal band. Both liner and chin strap are in excellent condition. The interior dome area clearly presents the original "pea" green paint of its 1935 era finish, before re-issue. Very good condition.
240	German WW II Fire Police service/parade helmet. - This lot presents a Fire Police helmet which has survived in near mint condition. The light metal shell is stamped "logo/Vorschriftsmassig/Lt. GESETZ 3.5,34" on reverse of nech shield area. The entire exterior and interior matte black paint is virtually 100%, with the exception of one 1/4" spot on the party shield. This, as well as th police decal remain in excellent condition. The aluminum comb is bright, without any damage. The interior leather elements, as well as the wide black chin strap, are in excellent condition, missing only the tie cord. A circular interior sticker near the helmet dome displays the "HMA/AACHEN" manufacturer's label. Helmet comes with a large black leather neck shield. In near mint condition.
241	German WW II M-35 Luftwaffe double decal helmet. - This example retains 50-60% original light blue paint finish. Much of the combat wear appears on the dome and surrounding areas. Both decals are retained with the Luftwaffe spread-wing eagle showing considerable "smudging", with over 95% of the tri-color remaining showing some surface staining. The light tan leather liner is complete and in very good condition. It resides on a 1940s style gray metal band, installed during re-issue or repair. The leather chin-strap is in place and in very good condition. Overall very good.
242	US WW II M-1 swivel bail combat helmet. - This example presents a WW II M-1 helmet with correct frontal rim seam. Rough cork or sand mixed dark green (OD) finish (about 95%) and later WW II period (post 1943) swivel bails with attached light green-tan web chinstraps. Interior Westinghouse Mfg. liner is missing the thin leather chin-strap, but is otherwise complete. Very good condition.

243	US WW II M-1 fixed bail combat helmet. - This lot presents an early war M-1 helmet with fixed bails, front rim seam and light tan straps. The rough cork or sand mixed paint retains most of its finish. The liner, missing the thin leather interior strap, is otherwise complete with leather band and web straps. The exterior of the liner was period repainted white with red painted dome surrounded by a black strip extending beneath 3/4ths of the red dome. A large black circle was painted at the front where a insignia could be placed. Finish shows age cracks and discoloration. This paint scheme has not been identified. Very good condition.
244	US WW II unit painted M-1 helmet LINER. - This M-1 liner presents a WW II era interior with dry leather sweatband attached to light tan webbing, except for the back 4" section added at a later date. The liner displays a now off-white finish with a 1" gray painted band surrounding the rim. A thin red painted line was applied just above the gray rim. Both sides of the liner display a gray painted shield (3"x2 1/4") with white letters "ASA/TC" within a painted red circle. Two large (2 1/4") letters "SG" in red-rimmed gray letters were applied to the liner front. It is believed that this liner was used by Army security guards, but definitive identification has not been made. Very good condition.
245	US WW II M-1 unit painted helmet LINER. - This M-1 helmet liner presents a WW II example painted a dark green satin finish. The rim area is painted with a 3/4" matte black edging with a thin red stripe painted above the black edge. The right side is painted "23" above the letters "AEB" in red paint within a white triangle. The opposite displays the letters "CCR" painted in black letters within a red line triangle. A silver lieutenant's bar is painted on the front. An interesting but unidentified helmet liner worn without its steel shell. Excellent condition.
246	US 19th century Army kepi. - This example presents a dark blue wool low crown kepi of 19th century post-Civil War vintage. Kepi /forage cap is fitted with a round age-creased short visor, thin black leather chin-strap held in place with two small brass buttons displaying an eagle perched upon on a shield device. Kepi front displays an artillery stamped brass cross cannon insignia holding the number "69". The dark blue cloth interior lining sewn over a 2" leather internal band and crown stiffener is template painted "22/SEP 80" in white. The internal leather and stiffeners are partly exposed due to the loose cloth lining. Only a section of original sweatband remains. Some moth damage on left crown. Fair condition.
247	German WW I M-16/18 steel helmet. - This example consists of a M-16/18 steel shell displaying a very dark green painted finish in fine condition. The shell is devoid of its leather liner and band. Very good but incomplete condition.
248	US Vietnam War era "Bush" hat. - This example presents a tan "Bush" style wide brimmed hat, the design of which is usually attributed to Australian allies from WW II to Vietnam. Paul Tibbets, pilot, Captain Theodore "Ted" Van Kirk, navigator, and Captain Tom Ferebee, bombardier, on this historic mission to Hiroshima. 256	Aviation print by renowned aviation artist Robert Taylor of the B-17 "Memphas Bell". - In flight formation, signed by Margaret Polk the Memphas lady who inspired the aircraft's name. Also signed by Colonel Robert S. Morgan USAF (Ret.). 1st edition UK published print, 18 3/8" x 13 1/2" visual. This lot also includes a pastel portrait of a USAAF officer in his chocolate brown tunic and visor cap. The image accurately presents the correct uniform elements, including a pilot's wings, ribbon bar with Distinguished Flying Cross (DFC), air medal with cluster, and Asiatic-Pacific Theater ribbons, with Distinguished unit citation ribbon on his right. The pilot's name, Captain Alfred J. Wood, was executed by artist Charles G. Kearney, who signed the portrait in red pastel. Pastel on paper, 10 1/4" x 14 1/2" visual, framed and matted. Very good.

Excellent detailed study of this formidable Luftwaffe fighter aircraft employing a (French) grassed field for their missions.. Color lithograph, 30" x 22" in posterframe. Very good.

270	US WW II Glider Artillery group. - This lot consists of war time memorabilia from a member of the 11th Airborne, 472nd Glider Field Artillery Battalion. His military issued motor vehicle permits indicate his duties included driving command vehicles and trucks. This group includes a Good Conduct and WW II Victory Medal and a fine hand embroidered cap patch for the Para-glider artillery. Part of a bracelet made of Australian coins indicates service in the South Pacific. Very good condition.
271	US WW II Army Air Force (AAF) "Air Apache" named grouping. - This lot presents the memorabilia of Mark R. Fox, Cpl., 498th Bomb Squadron, 345th Bomb Group (M), 5th Air Force, one of four squadrons comprising the famed "Air Apaches", South Pacific Air Theater. The focus of this group is a WW II B-15 flight jacket; hand painted on the left chest is the name "JOE", apparently Cpl. Fox's nickname. The reverse displays a fine hand-painted "Air Apache" insignia. The jacket remains in fine condition. Cpl. Fox received the Bronze Star and Purple Heart along with US campaign medals. He also earned his Gunner's wings, an uncommon award to his rank and were worn on the "Ike" jacket accompanying the B-25 in this group. This extensive group includes orders assigning Fox to the 345th Bomb Sq, 18 Dec., 1944, and armor training. Highlights include, assignment to 345th Bomb Squadron "Air Apaches", flight Records documenting raids on Japanese shipping, 1945, original paper "flyers"/chits, photo album with patches, field stations, including Tarawa, and "nose art" photos, lighter with brass "Air Apache" Indian head insignia, USAAF ring, a single dogtag, and a miniature and sterling 3" Air Gunner wing. A comprehensive, well documented WW II Air Corp group. Very good condition.
272	US WW II chocolate-brown Brit modified "Ike" 8th Air Force jacket complete with OS cap. - This lot presents a fine chocolate brown two pocket "Ike" jacket displaying a gilt bullion embroidered on blue felt 8th AAF shoulder patch, with a matching Army Air Corp example on the right shoulder. Prominent on the left breast is a finely executed silver bullion embroidered pilot's wing above two rows of campaign and award mounted ribbons, including the Distinguished Service, Air medal, and Purple Heart medal. Embroidered major's oak leaves are displayed on each shoulder strap with "AIR CORP/US" brass on each lapel and distinguished unit citation with oak leaf on right chest. Interior presents a fine tan silk-like lining complete with a matching Air Corp OS cap. This jacket was modified to accept a zipper closure rather than front buttons, possibly done in England. Excellent condition.
273	US WW II 101st Airborne enlisted rank "IKE" jacket. - This example presents a fine enlisted ranks two pocket "IKE" jacket displaying both a 101st Airborne "Screamin' Eagle" insignia as well as an "Allied Airborne" patch. The patches as well as the rank chevrons show the "X" stitch application, popular with enlisted ranks during that period. Left breast displays a sterling jump wing above a sterling Combat Infantry Badge (CIB) with ribbon bars below. Interior shows a standard lining in very good condition. Interior pocket shows a "Philadelphia Quartermaster Depot" inspection tag. Jacket comes with an enlisted rank overseas cap displaying the patch insignia of the Airborne Infantry. Very good condition.
274	US WW I 1st Division Aviation section lightweight tunic. - This lot presents a US WW I summer four pocket unlined tunic of lightweight tan-green cotton. The tunic displays a hand sewn felt shoulder patch consisting of a large dark blue "A" with a blue/red/white roundel super-imposed over the "A". This insignia represents the aviation section of the 1st Division, AEF. This insignia was hand-sewn to a cut piece of tan wool uniform material, then applied to the tunic. The tunic is fitted with dark brown painted buttons. The tunic collar shows a "US" dark brass roundel; the opposite side showing an aviation collar disc with silvered propeller super-imposed through a set of short stubby "wings", of possible French manufacture. The tunic is complete with a pair of light green pants fitted with leg ties. Also included is a triangular brass disc engraved "W.H.HANES/AIR SERVICE/ 18/FRANCE" one side and "A.E.F." engraved in large (3/8") fancy striated letters with long "dogtag" chain attached. Interesting example of an early US Aviation tunic. Good condition.
275	US Vietnam era USAF pilot's flight jacket. - This lot consists of a MA-1 flight jacket displaying multiple patches, including a fine machine embroidered name tag. This tag provides much information about this Vietnam War era pilot. Andy Arnold, nicknamed "Stormy", drove a McDonnell-Douglas F4-E Phantom II, a powerful twin-engine fighter supersonic bomber aircraft. Apparently Arnold was a Forward Air Controller (FAC), known to be high risk function used extensively during the war in Vietnam. This USAF issued flight jacket displays the following patches: Fightin' 56 patch showing a F-4 Phantom II above a pair of dice showing "II", a colorful "Yankee" Air Pirate complete with skull and crossbones machine embroidered in the form of a black flag, a 23rd Tactical Fighter Wing displaying the flying tiger of the 14th AAF is on the right breast, with a cynical in-country hand embroidered patch stating "SKI A SHAW/100 EXCITING TRAILS" with crossed skis and "5300 EL/NVN". Left shoulder displays a patch stating "419 TFFS /THE WORLD'S FINEST" surrounding a green three-leaf clover within a yellow arrow-shaped embroidery. The flight jacket, still retaining its original USAF contract label is in very good condition, as are its patches.
276	US WW II named Naval aviator's tunic, flight suit grouping. - This grouping belonged to Richard Cadiz, USNR, WW II Navy B-24 Liberator (PB4Y) seeing Anti-Submarine Warfare (ASW) service along the Eastern US coastline, against numerous German U-boats assigned to this theater of operations. This grouping includes of two light tan, four pocket uniform jackets. One example displays a fine gilt metal Naval Aviator's wings on left breast, with lieutenant rank blue and gold shoulder boards. The second example is a dress/service uniform displaying a set of fine gilt bullion embroidered Naval Aviator's wings. This tunic's sleeve shows rodent damage. Also included is a one-piece Naval aviator's light tan flight suit with multiple zipper closure pockets. The black/gold (buaero?) tag states "Suits, Flying, Summer-Type-S". Also included are two examples of naval overseas caps, matched to the uniform jackets, each with metal naval and rank insignia. Lot includes a series of photos of a partially submerged, but visible German U-boat under arial attack by a US Navy Liberator ASW Patrol Bomber. Lt. Cadiz continued his flying career post-war with some civilian aviation papers and map included in this WW II grouping. Very good condition.
277	US 19th century Army officers frock coat. - This example presents a long frock coat of dark blue wool with a standing collar surrounded by gold ribbon "tresse". The front of this double breasted coat displays two lines of seven round gilt buttons bearing the state crest of New York. The reverse of the buttons are stamped "Scoville Mfg. Co./Waterbury/State of New York". The sleeves bear large sewn gilt bullion loops of rank ending in a single gilt ribbon surrounding the cuffs. Finely hand-embroidered crossed rifles below a gold bullion number "14" refer to the 14th Regiment, New York State Militia, a volunteer group from Brooklyn. The unit saw service during the Civil War and Spanish American War. The interior is lined with satin material, with sleeves lined in white striped cotton. The interior neck displays a Buffalo, NY, tailor's label. Neither the exact age nor its service use has been determined, but displays significant age and wear. Good condition.
278	US WW II USMC dress blue tunic. - This example presents a dark blue four pocket full-length Marine Corp tunic. This tunic displays red piping around the collars, plain blue shoulder boards, frontal seams and at fancy cuffs. Two muted brown painted Marine Corp screw-back insignia are in place on each lapel. The sleeves display the Marine Corp rank insignia of a Private 1st Class. A Shooting Qualification medal resides on the left breast. The partial lining is in very good condition devoid of labels. All gilt metal buttons are in place. Very good condition.

279	US Army Air Force (USAAF) WW II four pocket service jacket of a 5th Air Force pilot. - This light tan tailor-made linen tunic displays all Army Air Corp collar brass, sterling lieutenant's bars, and three cuff bars representing 18 months service. Left breast displays a sterling pilot's wing above a ribbon bar, identifying this 5th Air Force pilot's Pacific Theater service. A fine gilt bullion embroidered on blue felt patch was hand-sewn to the left shoulder. The interior shows the partial silk-like lining with tailor's label and name tag, dated "4/1945" on the inside pocket lining. Light moth nips and light staining is noted on lower right front of tunic. The tunic is accompanied by a matching officer's overseas cap with a sterling lieutenant's bar on the side. The cap also shows staining. Very good condition.
280	German WW II Kriegsmarine white mess dress jacket of a lieutenant, engineers. - This lot presents a Kriegsmarine summer white issue mess dress jacket. This short jacket was worn as a formal evening wear attire, and was mandatory procurement item between 1936 to 1940. This white cotton jacket displays purpose made lieutenant shoulder boards with special white wool underlay. Each board shows the gilt metal "cog wheel" device representing KM career engineers. The front false closure has four gilt KM buttons each side. The two buttons with chain attachment is missing. A gilt metal pinback eagle is attached to the right breast. This original war time garment has turned light yellow characteristic of period white uniforms of the period. The lapels show evidence of collar tabs incorrectly sewn on this jacket, not used on this type of garment. A very interesting and uncommon Kriegsmarine jacket. Very good condition.
281	German WW II Waffen-SS tropical "Sahariena" style tunic. - This example presents a four pocket light tan cotton drill jacket equipped with dark tan pebbled metal buttons secured with metal rings on the inside of the jacket. The unique design, taken from an Italian design, features tunic material sweeping from the top of each shoulder down the frontal area and forming the breast pocket closures as it extends to the front button closure. The double pointed "dip" extends to the rear shoulder area. The left sleeve displays a burnished gilt BeVo embroidered SS sleeve eagle machine sewn to the garment, above a rank "V" insignia of burnished gold tresse on a black wool backing hand sewn below. This jacket is unlined but shows sewn reinforcements at the junction of sleeves to body. Four vent holes machine edged are below the armpit area. The interior right side shows typical measurement ink stamps and the M43 (1943) date stamp. A very uncommon Waffen-SS tunic. Very good condition.
282	German WW II Infantry Waffenrock parade dress tunic. - This elegant uniform jacket is tailored in light green doeskin cloth. A bullion embroidered Army spread wing eagle insignia is displayed on the right breast. The silver/aluminum embossed Litzen-type collar tabs rest on a white (Infantry) base, the left tab showing minor damage. Dark blue-green collar is piped in white with a 1.8 mm wide strip of aluminum tresse surrounding the top edge of the collar. The white piping is also present down the tunic closure, the rear scallops and fancy cuffs, along with the cuff patches again edged with a wide strip of tresse. The shoulder straps show dark blue-green straps piped both in white wool and aluminum tresse. The strap facing displays two rank pips and silvered numerals "36", representing the 36th Infantry Regiment. The boards in conjunction with the 1.4 mm wide tresse surrounding each sleeve above cuff indicates the rank of Hauptfeldwebel/Oberfeldwebel of Infantry. The interior is lined with a green silk-like material; sleeves are lined in green striped material. The left breast shows medal loops for horizontal and vertical mounted medal/medal bar. Overall in excellent condition.
283	German WW II Army Officer's dress "Greatcoat". - This example of Army officer's dress "Great Coat" exhibits a light green doeskin-like wool coat displaying a dark green wool collar. The coat is fitted with gray painted pebble steel buttons. The interior is lined with a gray silk-like material. The tailor's tag remains in place stating "A. Berger ... & Co./Potsdam". A strap and clip were employed for wear of the Army dress dagger. Neither shoulder boards nor collar tabs were worn with this coat. The reverse opening could be closed by use of the three buttons in place. A two button tailored "belt" crosses the lower back of the great coat. Excellent condition.
284	US WW II named C.B.I. aviator's group. - This lot consists of a very well worn A-2 leather flight jacket in relic condition. A large rectangular painted leather patch displaying the insignia of the Army Airways Communications System is displayed on the left breast. This very uncommon patch shows a world globe superimposed over a large lightening bolt with a plane circling around the globe. "Radio signals" are spreading from an antenna atop the globe. Included in this lot is a well used photo album exhibiting related patches (Air Corp, CBI, Radio Operations patch), with documents, orders, etc. of Staff Sgt. Danial B. Middleton, Radio Operator, AAFS. Middleton was a member of the 126th AAES Squadron, 745th AAF base unit, CBI Theater (India). Overall fair condition.
285	US WW II 101st Airborne paratrooper reinforced jump jacket and trousers. - This lot consists of a WW II paratrooper jump jacket. The jacket, made of olive color twill, displays the insignia/shoulder patch of the 101st Airborne Division "Screaming Eagles" sewn to the left shoulder. The jacket also has a WW II oilcloth American flag armband attached to the right sleeve simply by a single large blue safety pin. Although references indicate that these armbands were not worn for Normandy, they were worn during the Market-Garden combined paratrooper/ground assault in Holland. The otherwise "as issued" jacket and jump trousers were modified by sewing a gray-green canvas to the lower pockets and elbow area on the jacket and large trouser pockets. A 5/8" wide strap was sewn behind the reinforced pockets to help secure their contents. Apparently, over 90% of all jump jackets had these reinforcements added prior to the D-Day invasion. These modifications were performed by various riggers and tailors capable and equipped to finish the work prior to the pre-June 6th deadline. All snaps are unmarked brass. The front zipper head displays the mark "crown" as does the zipper stop, both in plated metal. All stitching, buttons, and reinforcement canvas is intact on both jump jacket and trousers. A rare US 101st Airborne paratrooper outfit. Very good condition.
286	US Brigadier General's tunic and field cap. - This lot presents an early Vietnam era "Jungle Jacket" displaying the name tag of "Archibald", with single five point stars on each lapel and MACV shoulder patch. A field cap displaying a single white star which, along with the lapel stars represent the rank of William T. Archibald, Brigadier General, US Army. This jacket is an early, uncommon design with tilted/slash pockets and visible button closures in excellent condition except for white paint "smudges" on the right sleeve. A news article, dated 1968, provides a short biography of General Archibald, with the announcement of his promotion to Brigadier General, US Army. This lot also includes a US Army barrack's chest with Archibald's current rank in yellow paint: "W. T. ARCHIBALD /MAJOR, INF." And a worn tag with "B. G. (Brig. General) Archibald" in print. Excellent condition.
287	US Vietnam soldier's photo album. - This personal photo album and related military papers documents the life of a Marine Corp. infantry man through his training and tour of duty in Vietnam. This album provides a detailed photographic account of this Marine's life starting with training at Camp Lejune, NC, and Parris Island, SC. He apparently entered service in Vietnam in the 3rd Btln, 1st Marines in 1967. The album includes approximately 150 photographs, presenting a stark depiction of a Marine's life and surroundings in Vietnam. Includes some very graphic photos, right along with photos of a visiting USO show. A comprehensive photo-narrative providing a close view of life as a Marine infantryman during his tour in Vietnam. Good condition.

288	US WW II soldier's group; service in 68th Field Artillery, 1st Armored Division. - This lot presents WW II artifacts from Pfc. Morris A. Brandman who saw extensive service with the 68th Field Artillery Battalion, assigned to the 1st Armored Division. According to his discharge record, Pfc. Brandman was a qualified heavy machine-gunner (M-2 Cal .50). Pfc. Brandman saw action during the Naples-Foggia, capture of Rome, Arno (River), Ardennes, and Po Valley (Italy) campaigns, earning a Good Conduct, European-African-Middle Eastern Campaign Medal with four stars, and the WW II Victory Medal, included with this grouping. The lot also includes Pfc. Brandman's well-used dogtag's on chain, ribbon bars, artillery "brass", prayer book (Jewish), Army song book, and a wartime published booklet "Road to Rome". Interesting grouping of a US GI who saw significant battle action. Very good condition.
289	German WW II KS98 dress bayonet. - This lot presents a KS-98 long pattern dress bayonet with all bright nickeled fittings and serated black composition grips. The bright nickeled blade is stamped with both the 1935-41 Carl Eickhorn logo and a much less common distributor trademark "Fahnen-Reuter/Munster". Scabbard retains all of its original black finish. This bayonet, complete with correct leather frog, rates excellent to near mint throughout. Near mint condition.
290	German WW II Army officer's dagger. - This example presents an Army dagger with silver fittings showing oxidation throughout. The grip is a dark orange color, uncleaned, devoid of any chips. The blade displaying the logo of Anton Wingen, "A.W.S.", shows dark areas with rust at the tip but no pits. The silver plated scabbard shows dark spots, oxidation, and shallow dents. Dagger is equipped with a set of hangers and aluminum portepee, both in very good condition. An untouched example. Good condition.
291	German WW II SA dagger by Herder. - This example presents nickel crossguards with a wood grip displaying no chips or cracks. The blade is mostly bright with light "sharpening scratches at the edges. Blade is acid-etched with the F. Herders/Solingen crossed key logo. The scabbard displays a worn brown anodized finish, without any dents. The dagger is equipped with a leather hanger. Good condition.
292	German WW II NSKK dagger by Herbertz & Meurer. - This example is fitted with nickel crossguards and scabbard fittings. The bright blade shows the acid-etched logo of "Herbertz & Meurer/Solingen-Gr.", rated as a rare maker. The black painted NSKK scabbard has retained most of the original black painted finish. The dagger is equipped with a brown leather hanger with an early unmarked clip. Very good condition.
293	Japanese WW II Type 30 late war rifle bayonet with wood scabbard. - This example displays a squared off pommel, straight, flat crossguard and plain wood grip secured with headless rivets. The blade displaying the maker marks of Toyoda, Nagoya, is without fuller, retaining virtually all of its original blue finish. The late war "last ditch" wood scabbard is held together with two bands of tightly wound cord. Metal tip is in place. An uncommon, untouched example. Excellent condition.
294	US WW II Army Air Force special unit patches. - This lot consists of six cloth six cloth patches and one metal example of Air Corp specialist patches. Included are US Technician, AAF Representative, Operations Analyst, US (AAF) Messenger and Technical Observer. All are machine embroidered on dark tan cloth with sewn edging. All are very uncommon. Very good condition.
295	German WW II Army "Afrikakorps"/tropical web belt and buckle. - This lot presents an Afrikakorps/tropical dark green painted steel Army buckle mounted on a light olive green web belt, complete with leather positioning strap. Belt catch matches the color of the buckle. Both belt and buckle are in good condition.
296	German WW II Bahnschutz Officer's brocade belt and buckle. - This lot presents a round metal officer grade buckle displaying a winged rail wheel, the insignia of the German Bahnschutz Police. The buckle is mounted on a fine silver-aluminum embroidered belt with a central blue stripe flanked by two black stripes. The brocade facing has a dark blue-black wool backing with a black leather positioning strap sewn to the backing. Both belt keepers are in place. Both belt and buckle are in excellent condition.
297	German WW II G-43 leather dual clip pouch. - This example presents a black pebbled leather twin clip pouch for housing two clips for the G-43 semi-automatic rifle. The studs and back ring are aluminum. The reverse has two leather belt loops and are unmarked. Interior flap is ink-stamped with a "G" and numbers. This item may have been Czech made for use with Czech manufactured /assembled G-43 rifles post-war. Excellent condition.
298	German WW II metal camouflaged spotlight truck toy. - This lot presents a German metal toy truck, battery operated, with rear flatbed on which is mounted a large spotlight. All metal surface is painted a camouflage pattern of tan-green-black "splotches", as were many of the full size units. The truck is equipped with two front and four rear black metal "tires". The spotlight is battery operated (not included) and propelled by the rear friction motor. Unmarked example. Excellent condition.
299	German WW II DAK/tropical issue combat/field canteen. - This example presents a dark brown composition molded canteen body complete with brown bakelite screw-cap and holding strap. The black metal cup is affixed to the canteen with olive-green straps surrounding the canteen. The molded body displays maker marks and date (1942) on the reverse side. All parts are in very good condition without damage. Very good condition.
300	German WW II combat "Y" straps. - This combat rig consists of three leather utility straps attached to a steel ring, used to hold the combat gear carried by the German troops. The leather straps, of black dyed tan leather are complete with all metal hooks and buckles. This set is in excellent condition.
301	German WW II combat belt, buckle and K98k cartridgepouches. - This set consists of a combat black leather belt with a pebbled aluminum buckle. Two black pebbled almost identical leather K98k cartridge pouches are attached to the belt. Very good.
302	German WW II combat belt and buckle. - This lot presents a black dyed leather belt complete with leather tongue for changing the belt length to the buckle. The buckle is a stamped pebbled aluminum Army example, without tab. Good condition.

The case is equipped with a large frontal flap with buckle closure. The interior flap is stamped with the maker's name and date (1940). An original example, complete and in excellent condition.
305	German WW II combat utility bag. - This example presents an issue green canvas field "utility/bread bag", fitted with black leather straps and loops. All metal "dish" type buttons were used for attachments and closures, employed as a utility container by German ground forces for carrying personal items, and anything that fit! This early 1940 dated example is complete with its web shoulder strap and in excellent condition.

A Jan 1945 dated capture paper "Helbronn/Office of Military Government Detachment G-28 1st Mil. Gvt. B.N. (SEP) APO 758 US Army" lists a typewriter, among other items for shipment to the US. Very good condition.
308	German WW II field binoculars and case. - This lot presents a pair of 6x30 German "Dienstglas" binoculars. These field binoculars are marked with the famous Leitz/Wetzlar logo and "beh" wartime code. Both lens show light cloudiness but without chips or damage. The binoculars are equipped with a black leather strap and are housed in a leather case with the typical spring-loaded closure strap. Interestingly, the top of the case displays the name Sgt. McGuire with this GI's ANS number, marking his captured souvenir. Good condition.
309	German WW II sighting compass and case. - This lot consists of a sighting compass marked with serial/model number and D.R.G.M. The compass comes complete with its black leather pouch and attached strap. An officer grade field item. Complete with the original makers tag. Very good condition.
310	German WW II Army and 2nd model Luftwaffe dress hangers. - This lot presents a set of Army dress hangers, bullion facing on light green velvet backing, and 2nd model Luftwaffe dress dagger hangers with blue/silver facing on blue backing. Complete with all metal buckles and clips. Very good condition.
311	German WWII period commemorative plate - war Christmas 1940. - This porcelain plate was issued during the period following invasion of the "lowlands" and France. The plate displays in German: "General Command, XIII Army Corp/War Christmas 1940" surrounded by oakleaves. The reverse is porcelain marked "9 1/2"". Very good condition.
312	German WW II/pre-war commemorative plate: Annexation of the Saar by Nazi Germany. - This example presents a light brown porcelain plate, 9 1/2" diameter, displaying very strong images in brown tints, of a German military or SA man grasping hands with a German Saarland worker. These images are superimposed on an eagle with down-turned wing, completing the propaganda visual with a swastika upon its chest. Below this image is the date "13. Januar 1935", the date a referendum giving control of the Saarland to Germany. The statement, "Deutsch is die Saar". Deutsch Immerder". The plate shows evidence of repair including a chip on the rim. The reverse shows typical stress lines with several stamps and ink marks visible. Fair condition.
313	German WW II Political Leader's service belt and buckle. - This example presents a light tan leather belt (2 5/16" wide) with a large round (2 1/4" diameter) gilt metal buckle. The buckle displays a large spreadwing eagle/swastika super-imposed over oak leaves surrounding the rim. Both the metal claw device and catch sewn to the belt show a gilt leaf design. Reverse of the buckle shows the RZM/circle and M 4/27 code in relief. Both leather keepers remain in place. Both the belt, gilt metal buckle and attachment devices are very good condition.
314	US WW II Naval aviation wood "wings" wall hanging. - This lot consists of a WW II vintage wall hanging displaying the insignia of US Naval aviation presenting a winged US shield and anchor. This carved wood example, measuring 36 1/2" wing tip to wing tip, and 18 1/2" at the anchor, replicates the gilt wings worn by US Naval aviators. Very good condition.
315	German WW II large carved wood eagle wall hanging. - This lot presents a massive carved wood German eagle clutching a large (to scale) swastika surrounded by a well carved wreath. Plaque measures 15" x 4". The lot also includes a solid brass desk model of a US submarine measuring 6 5/8" x 2 1/4" on a cast stand. Very good condition.
317	US Vietnam War award plaque. - This lot consists of a red wood base (12 3/4" x 7 3/4") displaying a large cut multi-piece pastic copy of the 1st US Marine Division "Guadalcanal" insignia with a "VIETNAM" plastic ribbon mounted below. A brass plaque states this commorative plaque was presented by Major General E. B. Wheeler, USMC, Commanding General 1st Marine Div. (Reinforced) for service, 1970.
